A dedicated network in high-demand areas

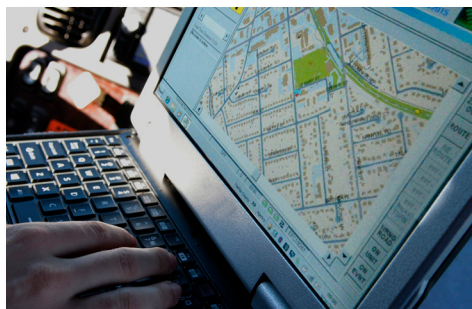

That's where FirstNet will help.



Priority access for first responders

The FirstNet network will offer true priority and security to public safety users, providing a robust network to support the use of cutting-edge applications for emergencies and day-to-day incidents. The FirstNet network will better enable first responders to:

- Send incident and situation data, video, images and text
- Share images and applications across multiple databases, allowing a common operational picture to develop as incidents unfold
- Carry location information and support streaming video
